DESIGN COMPETITION

The Design Competition is open to anyone, with a **\$100 prize**! You are welcome to take the project on yourself, or team up with another student. This is a no risk opportunity to throw out your wildest ideas! Have fun with it.

The site you will be addressing is Burtonsville Crossing, a shopping mall in Burtonsville, MD. In 2003 the mall opened, and was filled with bustling grocery stores, restaurants, and places to shop. Unfortunately, it began to deteriorate only three years later. By 2012 it was 70% vacant, and two years later, 90% vacant.

This is where landscape architects come in! There are plans to transition the space into a mixed-use parkand-ride. The mission is to "enrich the Burtonsville community, with excellent retail and dining options, civic space," and other uses that "fit Burtonville's unique identity and character."

How will you create economic solutions for this community? Consider how people can access the space, and how they move around within it. How can this space connect to the community? The large parking lot would create an abundance of stormwater runoff, how can you manage the water sustainably? What type of open space do you want to create?



There are no right or wrong answers. We encourage everyone to think creatively and give the project their best shot. What is your fearless idea?!
